"<u>When</u> do I move up to the intermediate lessons?" That's a question a lot of "veteran" dancers are often asked. A better question would be, "Am I ready to move up to the inter-

mediate lessons?"

An honest answer to either one will do you a favor. It may be, "Any time now," or it may be "You should go through the beginner classes again." That last reply may not be the one you were looking for, but it's advice you would do well to heed.

Actually the RSC has no rules, standards or qualifying tests which deem someone as "ready" to move up. It's entirely up to you, an individual choice.

Many instructors tell their beginner class that you shouldn't move to the intermediate lessons until you have a firm grasp of at least the basic. It would be better yet if you could do the turns, the preps, and the good ol' sugar foot.

You will do yourself a dis-service by going too soon. Many who do are intimidated and lose confidence, not to be seen again. It's well to note, the instructors at that level cannot spend much time reviewing the basic steps, they teach on the assumption that everyone has been through the beginner classes, at least once, and knows those steps. They quickly jump right into the Lean, Boogie Walk, Belly Roll, and the Pivot. Also, they assume you have been practicing. The intermediate steps, as are most shag steps, are built on the basic 8 steps to a 6 count. If that is not mastered, you will definitely be challenged.

So, after all that having been said, it's still your decision. Move up when you feel comfortable and confident to do so. Even though someone may tell you it's premature, we have no Shag Nazis to tell you that you cannot.

Now, let's take a moment and recognize our newest Richmond Shag Club members.
