

The article reports that as the marathons peaked in popularity, conversely their reputations diminished. They became known as "bunion derbies' or "corn and callus carnivals." The city of Oakland, concerned about health and safety, passed a law prohibiting them, and you'd get thrown in the klinker for up to six months if they caught you hoofing it out for a day or two.

Now, thanks to Rebecca Kaplan, Oakland can once again start the music, and maybe call our guys for some pointers on holding a dance marathon.

We started the week with approximately 600 pairs on hand. When inventory was completed at the end of Junior SOS 400 pairs were transported to the Chamber of Commerce Warehouse for storage.

As shoes were disbursed to the Juniors, donations continued to come in.

Many new pairs were donated and went out the door almost before we could get them on the tables. As donations come

in they are inventoried, checked for ware, cleanliness, and appropriate styles for the Junior Shaggers.

For those who wish to donate shoes during visits to North Myrtle Beach throughout the year, you may drop the shoes you are donating at The Shoe Center or Judy's House of Oldies.


