## **Vice President**

While it's certainly not the Eighth Wonder of the World, we think it could be. Of course I'm exaggerating when talking about the Richmond Shag Club's "portable" dance floor. If you've

ever attended a Boogie on the James Annual Party, you know exactly what I'm talking about. By the time people arrive on Friday afternoon, the floor is in place and providing the shaggers with a great surface.

It came to be in 2004 when then RSC President **Dewey Gunn** designed a floor to fit the Sheraton Midlothian ball room, our party host for quite a few years. It consists of 22 full sheets of 4' X 8' plywood, plus a half, for a total of 23, providing a dance surface of 720 square feet. To put that in perspective (but don't quote me), the dance floor at Visions is about 600 square feet. Dewey's design was fabricated by our own shagger extraordinaire **Sid Strawderman**, who also stored the floor at his Huguenot Builders shop for many years. The plywood sheets are permanently mounted on two by fours, which fit together similar to an erector set. Many of the sheets have been personalized by members and other clubs over the years; some would say adding "shag" character to the floor.

Installation begins on Friday morning, supervised by **Phillip Mitchell.** While one crew is prepping the Sheraton carpeted floor, putting down a protective sheet of plastic and marking the floor outline with masking tape, others are several miles away loading the floor, sheet by sheet, onto Sid's low-boy flatbed trailer. After being dogged and secured, it's then driven to the Sheraton, where they graciously allow us to tow it up the hill in the rear of the hotel to the back door of the ball room, which is as close as we can get it.

The plywood sheets, all numbered, are then placed in proper order and then attached to each other using wood screws. When all's done, she's a beauty to behold. In case anyone ever asks, there's a diagram


As always, our thoughts and prayers are with these folks/members as they recover from their losses, accidents and surgeries.
