# "And the Winner Is..."

Life is full of recognition awards for people's accomplishments and contributions. The Shag dance community, despite its comparatively small geographic footprint, is no different and

has a number of recognition awards which have been bestowed on RSC members over the years. It was pointed out at a recent Club Board meeting that new members hear of someone "being inducted" to this or that organization without any background on these awards. I thought it might be helpful to summarize the main awards for our membership. For more detail on RSC members that have received the awards discussed herein, visit our Club web page: http://

Within the Richmond Shag Club, in addition to our annual "most improved" dancer awards, the most respected recognition awards would be our "Spirit of Shag (SOS)" award and the Honorary Lifetime Member**ship** award. The "SOS" award is voted on by the active SOS members of the Club to recognize those that either over their full membership tenure or in the recent past or current year have been the greatest overall contributors to the Club. The guidelines for the SOS award are available from the RSC Board if you're interested. Sam Williams and Jinx Robinson were the most recent recipients of the 2017 RSC SOS award. The lifetime membership award is given out occasionally by the Board to members that, through their many contributions to the Club over the years, have earned this special honorary membership class. RSC has 11 surviving lifetime members.

Outside our Club, the next most prestigious award is probably selection into the Virginia Shaggers Hall of Fame (VSHOF). The VSHOF was formed in 1987 in the Virginia Beach area and membership additions each year are based on a nomination by an existing member and selection by the current active members to determine the top 8 candidates (based on their written resume of dance community contributions and accomplishments). The RSC has 39 living VSHOF members (and 2 deceased), constituting about 25 percent of all persons inducted into the VSHOF. The annual induction ceremony, in March this year, will include RSC members Cindy Slade, Tammy Varney and Jim Easter. It should be noted that throughout the Carolina Shag community there are a multitude of other local "shag halls of fame" on a local, regional and statewide basis. The most "prestigious" of these is generally considered the Beach Shaggers National Hall of Fame (http://

<u>www.shaggershalloffame.org/</u>). RSC founding member Earl Robinson is the sole RSC member honored to be inducted into this HOF.

For those that pursue a career of playing dance music for both personal and public enjoyment, there is the <u>As</u>-<u>sociation of Beach and Shag Club DJs (ABSCDJ) Hall of</u> <u>Fame</u>. RSC's own Cliff Merritt (now deceased) was inducted into this HOF in 2015, shortly before his passing. The ABSCDJ group sponsors the DJ Throwdown weekend in March in North Myrtle Beach to give their membership more opportunity to play their "jams" at "The Beach" among the various nightclubs that host the Spring and Fall SOS.

Within the Carolina Shag community, the ultimate recognition award is the "*Shaggin' Icon*" award given by the Association of Carolina Shag Clubs (ACSC) since 1995. As described on the ACSC Icon webpage, this award is: "... to recognize individuals who have made outstanding contributions within their own local... shaq club. Nominees for this award have made significant efforts and contributions to their local shag community. Although some...may go on to be well-known in the shag world (e.g. the ACSC, SOS, the Competitve Shaq Association (CSA) and the Assoc. of Beach & Shaq Club DJs), many ...may not be known outside of their own club. This award has come to be one of the most highly-prized awards that a shagger can attain". Candidates for this annual award are nominated by ACSCmember shag clubs (1 per club), scored and ranked by a special committee of the ACSC and the 5 winners are recognized at Spring SOS, receiving a lifetime SOS pass and being recognized in the "SOS Times". The RSC has had 6 members named "Shaggin' Icon" out of the 117 honorees from a hundred or so shag clubs since 1995.

Beyond the Shag community, the National Living Legends of Dance (NLLD) was established in 1994 to recognize major contributors to the larger dance community. Thus this award, while still concentrating on the Swing dance community (i.e. West Coast & East Coast Swing, Carolina Shag, DC Hand Dance, Jitterbug, Bop, Lindy, etc.), is open to recognize dance talent from countrywestern, Latin, ballroom and the music DJ communities as well. Held every November in Virginia Beach, the NLLD award ceremony has recognized 441 persons over the years of its operation. The RSC has had 24 of its members (with 22 currently living) inducted into the NLLD, receiving the "Star" award.

SOS is in full swing in Myrtle Beach. The faithful and hardcore come together to dance. The crowds pack a six-block area of North Myrtle Beach. The Shag joints are jumping. There are no fights in the streets nor even a serious frown in the crowd. The overriding emotion seems to be love.

Always in my mind, the word Shag descends from a blindingly cute girl who taught me the proper basic step, the fly-back and the boogie walk. Until Suzanne Cozart arrived on the Grand Strand, I was only a spectator, a wall flower at the beach bums' cotillion. As a late bloomer, I chased the sunburned peaches and listened to the stories the older dancers told of the glory days. The legend of the Shag was already larger than life by the first night I entered a graffiti-encrusted beer joint called The Pad.



The great dancers, male and female, were epic figures in my mind. Their way of doing and being became my model for attaining confidence and whatever physical grace I possess. I learned to tell verbal stories from dancers who filled me with gallons of ever-clear, hundred-and-ninety proof memories. In no small way, I owe my inspiration as a writer to the Shag and to the characters the dance produced.


