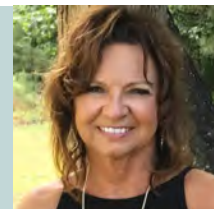

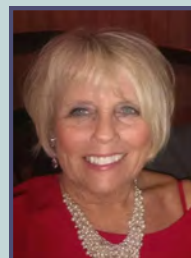

28th Annual Camp Fantastic Golf Tournament

After months of preparation and anxious days watching the ever-changing weather forecast days ahead of the April 16th tournament, the day finally arrived, with partly cloudy skies, temperatures in the low 50s and some mid-morning drizzle at the course. I thought we were doomed to a possible rainy day of golf, but the hour-by-hour forecast promised sunny skies at 1:00 o'clock, coinciding with the shotgun start for the event. Sure enough, around 12:45 pm the clouds parted and beams of warm sunshine brought out smiles on the faces of the 87 golfers assembled to support this annual event at the Golf Club at The Highlands.

This year, we had three teams from the Camp Fantastic community, i.e. Camp staff or family members of current or former campers, which helped focus the group on the cause for the day. Opening ceremonies were led by event coordinator Kevin Byrnes, who introduced RSC V.P. Stephanie Hockaday to extend a welcome to all the players, with a special welcome for the camp family teams and appreciation to all the volunteers that showed up. In keeping with a long tradition of a welcoming prayer to ask the Lord's blessing both on the golfers, the Camp Fantastic kids, U.S. military personnel around the world and public safety personnel here at home, Kevin's prayer recognized the 7th anniversary of the 4/16/2011 shooting massacre at Virginia Tech and asked for the Lord's blessing on the friends and families of those lost that day and the Lord's protection for those children, faculty and staff still attending our public schools, colleges and universities every day. After a review of the event rules by Club Pro Scott Graber, the teams were off to their starting hole.

The lunches were supplied by Subway, and sponsored by Virginia Commonwealth Bank. A delicious Italian buffet dinner was donated by Carrabba's Italian Grill of Midlothian. Golfers received "goodie bags" with an assortment of snacks and candies provided by Jane Renger, a golf kit of 3 balls and tees from Regional Decision Systems, LLC, sun-screen lotion donated by Affiliated Dermatologists of Virginia, and an assortment of golf shop coupons and a \$5 coupon from Zoup's Restaurant. Sponsors for the rental of the Pavilion included Dr. David Ferry (River's Bend Dentistry) and Jim & Dale Hern. The largest single sponsor was Arc3 Gases, Inc. which provided a \$1,500 donation to help cover miscellaneous expenses and add to the overall proceeds for Camp Fantastic. A total of 40 other sponsors, contributing from \$50 to \$500, raised \$5,550

dollars for the Camp Fantastic cause.

Last fall's selection of the Highlands as this year's venue was based on the lower per player fee that increased the potential surplus for the Camp campaign; moreover, the larger fleet of on-site golf carts (compared to the Meadowbrook Country Club (MCC) where the event was held in 2016 and 2017) allowed for the opportunity to accommodate more teams without incurring additional cart rental charges as was necessary at MCC. Unfortunately, the early Spring date seemed less attractive for more golfers to sign up, so the total team count was down by 6 teams from last year's record of 28 teams.

With the uncertainty of weather conditions throughout the afternoon, the coordinators made the executive decision to keep as many volunteers as possible working their jobs without exposure to the chilly Spring weather. Player registration was set-up under the Outdoor Pavilion roof, and Highlands maintenance staff dropped the plastic roll-up windows to create a wind-break from the chilly winds that swirled all afternoon. Instead of being spread out on the course, Stephanie Hockaday and her Poker Run lady dealers set-up operations in the Club grill, enjoying the indoor temperatures and convenient access to the grill's bartender!

Some \$2,700+ in raffle prizes were displayed and raffled off, and any unclaimed prizes were turned over to Bev Dillard to be added to the annual Silent Auction held in conjunction with the Club's annual "Boogie on the James" party in August. The first & second place teams turned in the same score of 58, or 14 strokes under par! The final 1st Place winner (determined through a tie-breaking process managed by the Club Pro using the team's scorecards), was the Caliper Corp. team (with RSC member **Howard Overbey**), which returned their \$500 winnings for Camp Fantastic, as did the 2nd Place team with their \$300 prize (which included RSC members **Lisa and Carrol Cox**). The 3rd Place team (from Camp Fantastic), won \$200, and refunded \$60 back for a Camp Fantastic donation. Other donations came from the Poker Run winner, who donated \$60 of his \$64 winnings, and the 50/50 winner as well. These unexpected donations off-set the \$140 retained by the 3rd place winner.

Of special note...RSC member Avery Goodwin shot a hole-in-one on #17 during the outing! Unfortunately, it didn't come on #5 where he would have won a 2-year lease on a 2018 Hyundai Sonata.

This year's group of volunteers were **great**, coping with somewhat adverse weather conditions without complaint (at least to me (LOL)) and helping cover jobs planned for others that were unable to attend at

the last minute. Everyone pitched in to make the event as much fun as possible for all the players and each other! A special word of thanks to:

Pam Tinsley, who managed the registration process and tallied up all the receipts,

Debbie Armentrout, who organized the lunch buffet set-up;

Stephanie Hockaday for running the Poker Run game and working with Kelli Mallinger to find the "winning" poker hand;

Brad West, for picking up the Subway lunches, and helping, along with others, in the packing up of the day's trash and re-arranging the patio furniture to restore it to its original arrangement;

Allen Batchelor, Tim Sullivan and Jimmy Easter for setting out and retrieving the 40-some hole sponsor signs scattered around the course;

Larry Herbert, for taking the hole-in-one spotter job for most of the afternoon;

Bill Boyer, for showing up on short notice



to spend the day taking pictures of teams, hole signs and players; (pictures are now in the Club's on-line photo gallery ([Click here to see images](#)))

Beth Ager, for coordinating the prize raffle.

But the Club and Camp Fantastic kids are indebted to **all** the volunteers who also helped throughout the day as card dealers, ticket sellers, raffle assistants, and other miscellaneous jobs throughout the day.

The Club can be proud of a net income of **\$13,- . S.!** (over \$2,000 more than last year) to start the year's Camp Fantastic escrow account. This gets us off to a strong start for the rest of the year! Many personal thanks to the sponsors, players, and volunteers that all contributed to this successful outing!

In keeping with their goal, this new section of the newsletter will assist by letting members know about future junior events where they can bring young family members for the purpose of learning to shag and dance to the music we love. —"SONNY BIRD"

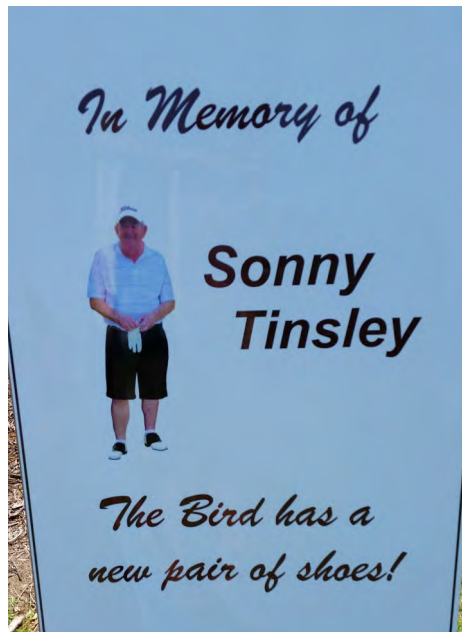

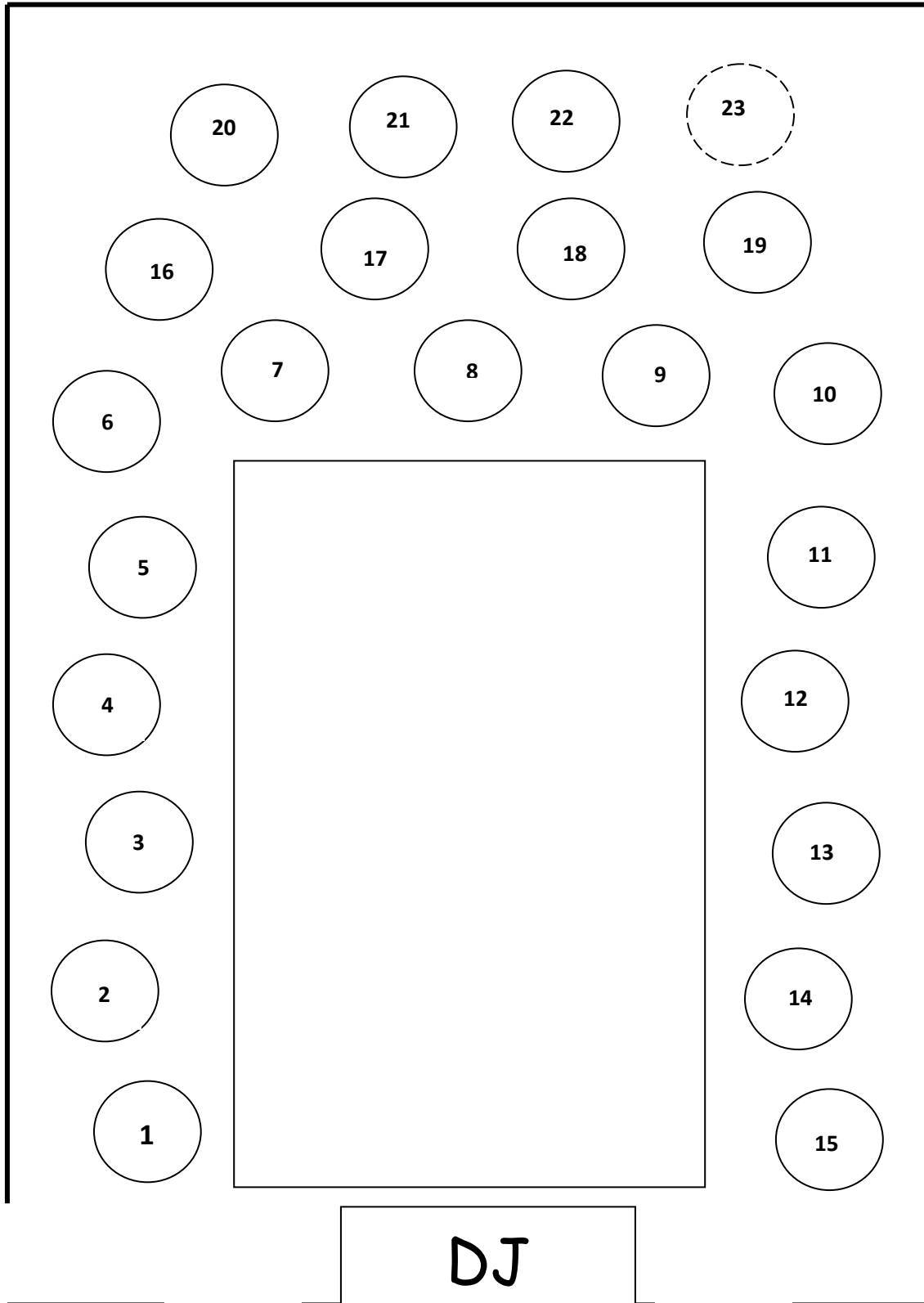
