

RSC LOVES CAMP FANTASTIC

My First Visit to Camp Fantastic By Barbara Hodge

On Sunday, 8/12/18, Paul and I met the rented van at Bill Boyer's house at 8:30 a.m. to ride with several others to the beautiful mountains of Virginia for the opening day of Camp Fantastic week. If you have ever taken a van or bus trip with members of Richmond Shag Club, then you know the fun starts the minute you board! Doughnut holes and mimosas were only turned down by the driver (mimosas, not the doughnuts). After stopping along the way for a late breakfast, we arrived at the Northern Virginia 4-H Center near Front Royal around lunch time to discover with surprise that a delicious salad, sandwich and dessert bar awaited us if we wanted to eat again with the camp counselors and staff. We chose to partake of iced tea and brownies and to walk around the gorgeous



campground and plush facilities.

Around 2:00 p.m. the campers arrived on very large buses, and we joined the counselors and staff in loud claps, cheers and shouts of welcome as the campers disembarked. The excitement and energy of the crowd was truly infectious. In spite of a sudden thunderstorm and downpour of rain, some of us helped the staff unload luggage from the buses and get all the pieces to the correct rooms in the bunk houses.

Next on the agenda was...MORE FOOD! A snack table was set up for everyone which was loaded with piles of wings, tomatoes and cheese and veggie trays to which small groups came in orderly turns. I wandered over to the crafts room to watch the campers draw pictures on fabric squares with permanent markers for a camp quilt. Soon after that, over 100 campers, ages 7-17, managed to change into swim clothes and make their way down to the enormous double-L-shaped swimming pool for their swim tests. Thankfully the rain clouds had moved off the mountain and the pool looked very inviting.

At poolside, our group took on the task of attaching colored bracelets to the swimmers' wrists to indicate which area of the pool they could access all through the camp week. The red and gold bracelets indicated limited access to either the shallow end or the shallow-to-deep leg of the pool. The most coveted bracelet was purple, which allowed the wearer to use the diving board in the

deepest end. To be awarded purple, the camper had to swim the longest section of the deep end without stopping, and as they neared the finish ladder, counselors, lifeguards and shaggers all began cheering and whistling to urge them on. We bravely held back our tears at the sight of so many surgical scars, medical ports, bald heads and other ravages of cancer as we attached bracelets to wrists while the campers gasped for breath but grinned widely at the same time. Then most of the purple band owners dashed around the cement pad for turns on the diving board. Meanwhile, the shallow ends of the pool were roiling with lots of splashing and laughing by the campers who qualified to be at those ends.

I was amazed at the large, well-qualified medical staff on board for the week or for parts of it. Before the swim tests, each child had to stop at the staff station to have sunscreen carefully applied to all exposed body parts. Only a small handful of campers could not get in the water, so staff members walked around with those students or organized a rousing game of UNO at a shaded picnic table. I took a moment to chat with one such boy seated with an aide near the diving board end. He held a cane and was obviously blind but with an enormous smile on his face and a very quick wit. Suddenly from the diving board came a huge splash, and the blind boy asked me, "Did I just hear a Belly Flop?" I told him that it looked like a Cannonball dive to me but that the swimmer had held one knee up and the other leg straight down. My new friend said, "Oh that's called a Can Opener. For a Cannonball dive you hold both knees up!" He happily explained the difference to anyone wishing to listen!

After completion of the swim tests, towels came out and some campers changed to dry clothes from their backpacks for the next event...MORE

FOOD! We all migrated to an enormous picnic shelter where a professional band played music and a volunteer group was setting up cookout food-- hamburgers, hotdogs, grilled veggies, baked beans, slaw, potato salad and oversized cookies. The process of serving was slow, because each camper had to stop by the camp doctor's chair first for the required brief daily interview, then move on to the nurses' station for hand sanitizer and small cups of medication, as needed. We shaggers spent some time before dinner doing a little dancing. Our tennis shoes would have been a challenge if the cement floor hadn't been slick from the earlier shower plus the humidity so that we could easily twist and turn when the music was right.

After dinner, the crowd migrated once again to the swimming area for room by room introductions of campers, many of whom were returning from previous years. I learned that about half of the adult counselors were former Camp Fantastic campers themselves. Next came the Sunday evening social, a pool party. Back into the sparkling water jumped most of the campers, while the Richmond Shag Club guests set up speakers, extension cords, etc. to add a bit of beach music to the party. We shagged and some of the counselors and one camper came over for a mini shag lesson. When the music shifted to line dancing, a huge crowd of counselors and campers joined us. Finally, about 7:30 p.m. we took down the audio equipment and said our goodbyes for the 2018 camp week. In spite of the long day, I would not trade anything for being part of this experience. Paul and I have donated regularly to the 50/50 ticket sales for Camp Fantastic through the Richmond Shag Club, but seeing where the money goes and all the happy smiles on real faces was priceless. If there was any conversation or fun to be had on the ride home, I couldn't tell you. I was ASLEEP!

I highly recommend that you try to set



aside one full day in August, 2019 for this wonderful volunteer opportunity.
